RECENT NEWS – H5N1 Outbreak

With the recent outbreaks of avian influenza virus A (H5N1 or HPAI) in 33 herds in eight states including South Dakota, Texas, Kansas, Michigan, Idaho, New Mexico, and Ohio, the Region 2 RESPTC team put together the below information for our community. To date, two people in the United States have tested positive for H5N1, one in 2022 and one 2024, both with mild symptoms (conjunctivitis) and have since recovered. Overall, the CDC's risk assessment for the general public remains low. As a precaution, clinicians should consider the possibility of H5N1 virus infection in persons showing signs or symptoms of acute respiratory illness who have relevant exposure history (e.g. people exposed to birds or other animals with confirmed or suspected H5N1).

Clinicians should consider H5N1 in a patient with influenza or influenza-like illness (ILI) and any of the following exposures in the past 10 days:

- Close contact with potentially infected sick or dead wild or commercial birds or animals
- Direct contact with water or surfaces contaminated by potentially infected sick or dead wild or commercial birds or animals
- Handled or consumed undercooked animals or unpasteurized milk and dairy products
