#### **OUTBREAK AND SPECIAL PATHOGEN NEWS**

## **Nipah Virus Disease**

India's Kerala state reported <u>at least 2 cases</u> and one death from Nipah Virus Disease in July. Nipah Virus is spread through contact with infected animals, consuming soiled food/drinks, or contact with bodily fluids of an infected person. <u>Symptoms</u> include fever, headache, cough, sore throat, and difficulty breathing. Symptoms may progress to include brain swelling, confusion, and seizures.

#### **H5N1 Avian Influenza**

Globally, cases of H5N1 continue to rise. <u>Cambodia</u> reported a spike of cases this month, bringing the annual total to 12 human cases and 6 deaths in 2025. There are no reported human cases of H5N1 in New York State. The CDC ended the <u>H5N1 emergency response</u> on July 7<sup>th</sup>, 2025.



#### R2RESPTC'S DR. CHAN PUBLISHES ARTICLE ON HCID PREPAREDNESS

Dr. Justin Chan, NYC Health + Hospitals /Bellevue's Epidemiologist and a core member of the R2RESPTC team, recently published an article on high-consequence infectious disease (HCID) preparedness. HCIDs are acute human infectious diseases with high illness and case-fatality rates, few or no available effective treatment or prevention options, and the ability to spread in the community and within healthcare settings. This publication describes essential aspects of healthcare system preparedness for and response to HCIDs and outlines priority areas for further investment in HCID preparedness, care, and research. #### **R2RESPTC PARTIPATES IN INTERNATIONAL PATIENT TRANSPORT EXERCISE**

The Region 2 RESPTC Team at NYC Health + Hospitals / Bellevue participated in the US Department of Health and Human Services (HHS) Administration for Strategic Preparedness and Response (ASPR) Tranquil Passport Exercise on June 26<sup>th</sup>. This international exercise simulated a High-Consequence Infectious Disease (HCID) response in preparation for the 2026 World Cup. Eight patient actors were flown from Toronto to seven High Level Isolation Units in the United States using ASPR's new asset – the Portable Biocontainment Unit (PBCUs). The Region 2 RESPTC team activated the Special Pathogen Unit (SPU) at Bellevue – testing clinical protocols and ensuring unit readiness especially for a pediatric patient.

## **OUTBREAK ADVISORIES AND RESOURCES**

## **H5N1**

Providers should consider the possibility of H5N1 in patients who had contact with potentially infected sick or dead animals in the past week and show the following symptoms:

- fever,
- cough,
- sore throat,
- body aches,
- headaches,
- fatigue,
- eye redness (or conjunctivitis), and/or
- shortness of breath

Providers should report any non-sub typeable influenza A cases to their Department of Health.
