# MAY COMMUNITY SPOTLIGHT | PATRICIA ANN TENNILL

Patricia Ann "Trish" Tennill is the Director of Nursing and the Special Pathogen Program Nurse Lead at Bellevue Hospital. She brings decades of experience as an ICU nurse, including first-hand experience responding to multiple special pathogen outbreaks and leading special pathogen training and education sessions across the nation and for international partners. Trish has been involved with the Special Pathogens Program since 2014 as a nurse leader responsible for coordinating and overseeing all nursing operations on the Special Pathogens Unit, including the development of protocols concerning the movement and care of patients with special pathogens and the subsequent hands-on training for all staff involved in the Special Pathogens Program. This included the development and facilitation of the Region 2 Special Pathogen Response Skills Training, providing ~20 healthcare facilities in New York and New Jersey guidance on how to care for patients under investigation (PUI) or confirmed with highconsequence infectious disease (HCID). In addition to her work at Bellevue, Trish also serves as the Workgroup Chair of Infection Prevention and Control for the National Emerging Special Pathogens Training and Education Center (NETEC). In this role, she teaches fundamentals of safe biocontainment practices to health care professionals across the nation. Furthermore, the American Association of Critical-Care Nurses recently awarded the special pathogens team led by Trish their Beacon Award for the team's dedication to the care in the unit. We thank her for her continued dedication and care!
